Dr. Nicole Dorsey, Ph.D. - Training Director, Child Clinical Psychology

Dr. Nicole Dorsey has been a licensed psychologist since 2002.

She obtained her undergraduate degree in Psychology from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Her doctorate degree was in Clinical Psychology, with a Child Specialization, from Ohio University in Athens, Ohio.

She moved to Houston to complete her doctoral internship at Baylor College of Medicine as the Child Specialty intern.



Dr. Nicole Dorsey, Ph.D. - Training Director, Child Clinical Psychology

Dr. Dorsey has extensive experience in working with at-risk and underprivileged youth through her work with Harris County Protective Services for Children and Adults, Harris County Children's Assessment Center, and Harris County Juvenile Probation Department.

In her current role as the Training Director of the Harris County Juvenile Probation Department, she oversees the training experiences of graduate-level psychology practicum students, doctoral interns, and post-doctoral fellows of the Forensic Unit. The Forensic Unit conducts comprehensive psychological evaluations to youth who are currently involved with the juvenile probation department.

Dr. Dorsey is also involved in contract work conducting evaluations for individuals seeking disability for mental health issues, veterans, and juvenile-justice involved youth.



Dr. Luis D. Medina, Ph.D. - Assistant Professor, Clinical Neuropsychology

Dr. Luis D. Medina is a licensed clinical psychologist and cultural neuropsychologist.

He received his B.A. in psychology from Yale University and his Ph.D. in clinical psychology/neuropsychology from the San Diego State University/University of California San Diego Joint Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology.

Dr. Medina completed his clinical internship at the West Los Angeles Veterans Affairs Medical Center (geropsychology track) followed by a postdoctoral fellowship in adult clinical neuropsychology at the University of Colorado School of Medicine.



Dr. Luis D. Medina, Ph.D. - Assistant Professor, Clinical Neuropsychology

As a member of the Rocky Mountain Alzheimer's Disease Center at the University of Colorado, he performed postdoctoral research in cognitive aging and neurodegenerative disease.

His research examines the cultural neuroscience of cognitive aging, particularly in the context of Alzheimer's disease and related dementias (ADRD), as well as the clinical assessment and diagnosis of ADRD in underrepresented populations.



Dr. Milena Keller-Margulis, PhD - Associate Professor, School Psychology

Milena A. Keller-Margulis, Ph.D., is an Associate Professor of School Psychology in the Psychological, Health, and Learning Sciences Department (PHLS) in the College of Education (COE) at the University of Houston (UH).

She studies the technical adequacy of curriculum-based measurement for use in response to intervention and has authored over 25 peer-reviewed articles in journals such as School Psychology Quarterly, School Psychology Review, and Learning and Individual Differences.



Dr. Milena Keller-Margulis, PhD - Associate Professor, School Psychology

Dr. Keller-Margulis is currently the Principal Investigator of a grant from the Institute of Education Sciences to study the development of automated WE-CBM and is Co-Principal Investigator on a Spencer Foundation grant to study the use of curriculum-based measurement with students with autism spectrum disorder.

She is also an associate editor for the Journal of School Psychology.

Dr. Keller-Margulis is a licensed psychologist and licensed specialist in school psychology with considerable experience conducting research in public schools.



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
